COMMISSIONER'S REPORTS

Building Permits, Planning and Zoning: no report

Cemetery, Refuse and Streets: Councilman Feaster reported the Maintenance Department was busy with snow removal, water leaks and line breaks. The Maintenance Department removed the Christmas lights throughout town. Their department received the new dump truck that was secured with ARP funds. He further reported that trash pick-up will be delayed one day on February 21, President's Day.

NEW BUSINESS

Councilman Riggleman made a motion to approve the transfer of ARP funds approved for the Mon Forest Town Partnership initiative to the Petersburg City Pool Splash Park and new garage door openers at the maintenance shop, estimated at \$4,000. Councilman Spanswick made a motion to approve new updates to the City Employee Handbook. Councilman Feaster seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Feaster made a motion to approve the purchase of a new HVAC system to be installed at City Office with ARP money. Councilman Spanswick seconded the motion. The motion carried.
